Session Notes from November for the December Herald

Session conducted its stated meeting on November 10 to hear reports and transact business. A summary of actions follows.

Featured Report: Nominating Committee

Judy Duffy reported that the committee has confirmations from four deacons. They are still working on two more elders, but have commitments for two three-year terms and one one-year term

Pastor's Report:

Several issues were raised for consideration and action.

The Interfaith Council has expressed support for the Afghanistan refugee resettlement project and meetings continue. It is still early, but participants are positive and the council will take the lead in Terre Haute. The interest group is called Welcoming Circle and has representation from churches, ISU, Rose-Hulman, and St. Mary of the Woods. They anticipate twelve areas of need, including housing, interpreters, school, security, food, medicine, employment, ESL tutoring, and religious integration.

Should we resume fellowship in the building now that Vigo County is in yellow status? There will be concerns as well as some relief now that children can be vaccinated. Session approved (with two abstentions) a motion to serve food after Hanging of the Greens on November 21 and to begin coffee hour in December as long as the county Covid status does not worsen. Messaging will be adjusted so that no one feels pressured or left out.

Session approved a motion to resume regular communion operations (although bread will still be bagged) as long as the county Covid status does not worsen. Participants will be reminded to put cups into the pew racks and not back into the trays.

The Riggins are expecting their third grandchild.

Treasurer's Report: Bruce McLaren presented the report. The October deficit is slightly larger than predicted. Yearly expenses are well under control. The cost to repair the bus was taken from the Memorial Fund.

Christian Educator's Report: Ellie reported that much is planned for the rest of the year. The Giving Tree will again be out in front, and the pageant is December 12. She shared ideas for a banner showing both the PCUSA rainbow sign and the Matthew 25 logo to display below the permanent church sign. General support for the new banner was given.

Clerk's Report: Session reviewed the list of historical church documents and had no objection to having the clerk, in consultation with others in the church, decide which items to deliver to the Presbyterian archives at Hanover College.

Deacons: Philip Smith will coordinate a schedule for bus assistants.

Reports and Action Items from Committees and Commissions:

I&S: The committee will meet December I to begin to fine-tune the draft budget. They expect insurance and utilities to increase.

Mission: The Afghan Resettlement Project has the potential to be big. Federal funding is available and a total of \$5000 will be expected from the Terre Haute community. We have heard from William Seo, who is working under the HEME fund's secular, non-profit umbrella to assist people remaining in Afghanistan.

Discussion: It is premature to look for technology grants until we have a better idea of whether the digital ministry will continue now that pandemic restrictions are easing.




It is time for Christmas giving at Central.

Dear Friends,

It's been quite the month. As I sit at the computer tonight writing this note, I had anticipated returning to work today - at least part time. The reality hit me today that I still have another 5 weeks of doing nothing. At one time, that sounded like a good idea. At this point in my recovery, I wish to be doing something.

Little did I realize when I went in for surgery on the 26th of October, the extent of the required work that would need to be done. An overnight hospital stay turned into a 4 night stay. Upon my return home, I had (and still have) numerous restrictions. Recovery was going well until two weeks ago when I dislocated that hip. I spent the next day in the emergency room receiving treatment. The surgeon accessed the x-rays and found a problem with the hip socket when it was popped back into place. On Monday, November 22, I underwent a third surgery on the hip to replace the ball. I am once again home recovering.

Through this time, I have been blessed by the many cards, texts, phone calls and food that has been delivered to our house. I thank you for the many prayers that have been lifted on my behalf. They have been felt and much appreciated. I am truly blessed to be a part of such a caring church that has become like a family to me. I miss you all. I do not anticipate the doctor will let me return before the middle of January. I'm counting the days until I can return to work.

During this time at home, as I sit looking at the Christmas tree, I am reminded of the true reason for the season. I have not traveled this journey alone. I have felt calmness and peace through it all. That tiny babe born so long ago brought that peace and calmness. I will enjoy my tree with the lights this year (as I did last year also!), and remember to share His love and goodness with others this season.


Lessons and Carols Sunday, December 12!
