2022 Lenten Series - This year we will be offering a Lent Fellowship series for all ages beginning on Sunday, March 6. As of now we will meet at 4:30 pm for about an hour and will not be offering a meal. If things continue to be stable and improving with Vigo County's COVID numbers we hope to be able to change that soon. We will be using Traci Smith's book "Faithful Families for Lent, Easter and Resurrection" as a guide of sorts and hope to offer a chance for everyone in our church to simply come together for a time of fellowship and a chance to slow down and explore the gifts of this Lent season. All ages are welcome and encouraged to attend. The series will run March 6, 13, 20, 27 and April 3 and 10. All gatherings will be held at Central Presbyterian church in the Fellowship Hall. Souper Bowl of Caring '22 - The annual Souper Bowl of Caring event put on by Highpoint Youth was once again a huge success! Sunday School Updates - In Person Sunday School for all ages resumes on Sunday, March 6! We are excited to be meeting in person just in time to observe the Lent season. Preschool, Elementary and Middle School age children will be doing a six week series of lessons using the "Follow Me" Curriculum with each week focusing on a different spiritual discipline such as prayer, fasting and listening to God. Our high school youth will be led by Jill Conner and will continue to assist the first Sunday of the month in teaching our elementary group.

New adult class starts March 6! Allen Holder will be leading a class on Sin on Sunday Mornings from March 6 through April 10 (Palm Sunday) starting at 9:30 in the Lounge. Jesus commanded those whom he helped to sin no more, see John 5:14 and 8:11, but working toward this goal is a tall, tall order. For what exactly is sin, and how do we possibly avoid it in our fallen state? Scriptural references and theological studies, which often differ in their interpretations, make it difficult to be certain about what is, and is not, sin. We will examine a new characteristic of sin each week by reading scripture and theological perspectives, followed by a conversation to share our thoughts. We will end on Palm Sunday and await the amazing grace of our Lord, who died for our sins on Good Friday and who rose on Easter to prove the greatest of all clemencies. Everyone is welcome, and no previous knowledge or forethought is needed. Come for a few or attend them all, just know that you are invited and that differing opinions will be respected and appreciated. Masks will be encouraged to help keep us as safe as possible as we gather to contemplate the great mystery that is our faith.
