#### **Sunday School Updates**

Sunday school continues for children, youth and adults and will run through May 21. Children continue studying the practice of "Love God, Neighbor, Enemy" from the PCUSA curriculum "Follow Me". High school age youth have been participating in the Matthew 25 film series which ended March 26. They will meet separately beginning after Easter.

Our adult Sunday School wrapped up their film series Matthew 25 and Congregational Vitality on March 26.

Pastor Mike will be leading an adult class that is planned to begin on April 16. Look in your bulletin and the e-news soon for more info about what this class will cover.

Confirmation class also continues for our middle school age children and our confirmands are preparing for their faith projects and statements that will be shared with the Session on April 12. Confirmation Sunday is planned for April 23, 2023.

A reminder that our nursery is also fully open and is staffed on Sunday from 9:15-11:30. Babies and toddlers are welcome during the Sunday School time with the preschool age group meeting in the attached classroom. During worship children ages 3 and younger may go to the nursery while our older children ages 4 to 1st grade are invited to come to worship and then join our adult leaders for children's worship in the lounge. Children in 2nd grade and older are encouraged to remain in worship with their adults following the children's moment. Activity bags for all ages are located in the back of the sanctuary.

#### **Seekers and Searchers Bible Study**

Our Seekers and Searchers Bible Study group meets on the fourth Thursday of each month from 10-11:30am and will meet next on April 27. They enjoy refreshments and fellowship time together and 45-60 minutes of bible study. The group has begun a new study titled "Jesus: The God Who Knows Your Name" by Max Lucado. We will use the DVD of this text as our guide and also follow along in individual study guides. Pastor Mike will be our primary leader.




# 14th and Chestnut Center Annual Banquet

#### Pastor's Report:

In addition to his written report, the pastor informed the session that member Victor Tilstra-Ferrell and his wife Emily had requested that their infant son, Samuel Tilstra-Ferrell be baptized at Central. A motion to approve the baptism was made and approved.

#### **Treasurer's Report:**

Treasurer Bruce McLaren presented the report and provided an update on changes to the church's investment accounts.

#### **Reports and Action Items from Committees and Commissions:**

*Christian Nurture:* The church retreat will be at Pyoca April 28-30, and Vacation Bible School is planned for the first week in June at the church. Volunteers are needed to help with future Parents' Nights Out.

*Church Life:* There will be a Fifth Sunday carry-in lunch on April 30.

**Facilities:** The commission is gathering bids to replace the choir lights with LED fixtures that are mounted in a ceiling housing. They will investigate exactly which lights need to be replaced; the cost will be covered from cumulative maintenance. We will also check on sidewalk maintenance. Tom reminded everyone to keep the paths to the fire doors clear.

*Mission:* The committee considered how to prioritize and allocate local benevolence, having received some feedback during Lenten series discussions.

**Commissioner to Presbytery**: Alan Harder summarized the proposed amendments from last year's General Assembly that presbyteries are considering. POV voted age on all but one of them.


