

From the Pastor's Desk

Last Sunday it felt as though we all belonged to a winning team. We had a good Sunday school hour. Lots of folks attended worship. The choir was in good form. Valeri Kershaw delivered a hilarious and thoughtful Children's Moment. The preacher preached shorter than usual. We got to perform a baptism. And we received three confirmands into active membership. Win, win, win, win! Study after study reveals that the most common reason people visit a church for the first time is that a trusted friend invited them. Session Notes from April for the May Herald

Session met on April 12 to hear reports and conduct routine business. Highlights from the meeting appear below.

Reception of confirmands

Christian Educator Ellie Templeton presented Henry Conner and Ethan Kershaw and reviewed the work they

had done to learn about the Bible, PCUSA polity and history, and Central. During the process they met together with parents and prayer partners for wonderful discussion. The boys shared their moving faith journey projects and were asked the membership questions, which they answered in the affirmative. A motion to accept Henry Conner and Ethan Kershaw into membership was approved with a resounding hallelujah and they signed the membership register. In a called meeting on Sunday, April 23, session met with

Mackenzie Racop. She too described her moving faith journey and answered the membership questions. All three were received into membership with joy during worship on April 23.

Pastor's Report:

In addition to his written report, the pastor raised several issues for consideration.

- The church has received a bequest from the estate of former member Dale McKee to establish the Dale and Nancy McKee Endowment Fund, with the fund's income to be used for educational purposes. There will be a more public announcement with the McKee family in attendance in the future.
- Pastor Mike reported that his recent study leave concentrated on reading and discussion about ways to reach the "nones" and "nons" in today's world. He cited polling statistics and opened a discussion about what we do, who we can be, and what we will need to keep and what we will need to change to grow in spirit, mission, membership, and attendance.
