

Sunday School Updates

Sunday School for this school year has wrapped up and we have a wonderful year! Our elementary age children were able to spend time learning about the practices of "Making Peace", "Practicing Generosity", and "Loving God, Neighbor and Enemy" in both classroom and group settings. They also spent time on service projects that included making cards for our Deacons to give to their flocks, particularly those who are unable to get out often. They also worked on fleece blankets that were donated to Union Hospital pediatrics. Our middle school age youth assisted with service projects and completed confirmation with three youth being confirmed earlier this spring. Our high school youth continued to be a huge blessing to our church and helped teach our elementary classes from time to time, assisted during service projects and joined in on some of the Matthew 25 film studies classes too. Both middle and high school age youth also helped with usher duties once a month.

Adults at Central enjoyed a full year of continued study on living fully as a Matthew 25 church and did two series of classes. The first in the fall discussed Systemic Poverty and the second in the spring discussed Congregational Vitality, both pillars of being a Matthew 25 church. Pastor Mike finished off the year with a class series on Congregational Vitality in the post modern world. All were well attended and provided a space for meaningful learning and discussion about how we can continue to work toward being a strong Matthew 25 congregation.

Summer Children's Worship

During the summer we will continue to have nursery care for babies and toddlers during worship. I am also working with our nursery staff to lead a more casual children's worship time in the down-stairs playroom with a story and craft each week as well as playtime. This will continue to be open to our kids ages 4 through 1st grade. Children will attend worship as usual then leave after the Children's moment and be escorted downstairs by myself or another assigned adult. Please pickup your children in the preschool playroom following worship. This program will begin June 4 and will run through August.

A reminder that our nursery is also fully open and is staffed on Sundays this summer from 10:15-11:30. During worship children ages 3 and younger may go to the nursery while our older children ages 4 to 1st grade are invited to come to worship and then join our adult leaders for children's worship in preschool classroom. Children in 2nd grade and older are encouraged to remain in worship with their adults following the children's moment. Activity bags for all ages are located in the back of the sanctuary.

Session Notes from May for the June Herald

Session met on May 10 to hear reports and conduct routine business. Highlights from the meeting appear below.

Featured Report: Facilities Commission

Tom Bogigian explained that masonry work will need to be done on all four sides of the church, noting that all work is becoming more costly. Facilities and finance will communicate about projected costs for masonry and window repair. Those who open and close the movable walls need to know the proper way to do so. The replacement decision for the round choir spotlights will be referred to the worship commission for a recommendation.

Pastor's Report:

In addition to his written report, the pastor raised several issues for consideration.

Previous strategic planning groups set their own review policies so the most recent one will be asked to do the same.

Should the Pyoca Retreat be continued? Member attendance this year was lower than in the past, so the CN commission will contemplate the question.

Based on his study leave work, Pastor Mike again asked the session what is next for this great church in today's culture. What do we see as our worries, hopes, and most pressing needs?
