Pancakes, sausage and fruit will be served by the Christian Nurture commission and we will gather for a time to fellowship as we prepare to begin the new Sunday school year.



The Salt Shaker dinners began at Central almost 15 years ago! Traditionally, we have mixed a different group of 7 - 9 people several times a year at a host's home to share a meal. Participants have been shaken up each time so they get to be with someone different. It is a great way to meet new people and learn new things about old friends.

If there is sufficient interest, we will again create a schedule for gatherings during 2023-24.

- Fellowship, not stress, is the first priority! As we have in the past, we will develop the schedule with a designated host and guests. The host will supply the entrée and will assign other dishes to guests. Hosts should feel free to adapt this in any way that they'd like.
- To simplify the gatherings, we'd like to encourage hosts to plan an evening that makes sense for them. Traditional dinners are always fun but feel free to experiment. If it works better for you and your guests, you could put on a pot of chili, have people come just for coffee and dessert, or go on a picnic. It is certainly fine for a group to meet at a restaurant for a Dutch treat dinner.


So that we can work around busy times of the year, we will set up hosts and guests for three gatherings.
