


### **HighPoint Youth** — Tim Ghogle, Youth Director

HIGHPOINT YOUTH began this year with the annual Youth & Family Night on Sunday, September 10, and launched the new series "STEWARDSHIP". Our youth and their families came together to celebrate our youth and their accomplishments last academic year and encourage them in all their activities this upcoming school year, plus learn about what the bible says about being good and faithful stewards.

6 years ago, the youth design team created a 6-year theme for each year for our youth group. The Themes were Spiritual, Theological, Biblical Knowledge, Mission, Relationships, and Stewardship. I'm pleased to say that we are in our 6th year of learning and discovering Stewardship. Based on 1 Peter 4:10, our youth will learn to use their God-given gifts, skills, and talents as faithful stewards. This theme and series touch on Financial, Personal, Pastoral and Theological, Economic and Community, Youth and Leader, Judicial, and Academic Stewardship, to mention a few - all emanating from biblical passages. #### **Session Notes from September for the October Herald**

Session met on September 13 to hear reports and conduct routine business. Highlights from the meeting appear below.

#### **Featured Report: Finance Commission**

Bruce McLaren reviewed the duties of the commission, reminding session that their work is to monitor, review, and plan. They oversee investment strategy, the use of credit, the results of and need for capital campaigns, collection counting, and financial review. They work with the facilities commission to understand the need for funds for major projects. We are currently retiring principle at a faster rate than required and are not soliciting extra funds for interest, although contributions are always welcome.

#### Pastor's Report:

In addition to the items in his written report, session discussed the constitution of the strategic planning task force. Committees, commissions, and deacons will be asked to supply a member and member(s) at large will be encouraged.

#### Treasurer's Report:

Treasurer Bruce McLaren presented the report and provided updates. Summer revenue is variable, as expected, but expenses are under control and there is a year-to-date surplus. We continue to pay ahead on the principle for the mortgage. A new CD was purchased in August at the rate of 5.25%.



#### Reports and Action Items from Committees and Commissions:

*Christian Nurture:* Additional volunteers to lead children's moment and children's worship would be greatly appreciated. Session considered the interest from the McKee Endowment Fund and approved the following motion: All of the interest from the McKee Endowment shall be allocated for use by the Christian Nurture Commission.

**Mission:** The committee reported that United Campus Ministries is seeing a shift in its student profile from a wide group of international students from many faiths to a more typical domestic group this year. The board is working with Dr. Nathan Schaumleffel to develop a process for serving this group; he may be a good resource for our strategic planning. Members of the Terre Haute Interfaith Council are visiting churches and we are welcome to join them and to host the group.

*Old Business:* Bruce McLaren and Alan Harder suggested session formally address the future of the video ministry, noting that it is time to replace the two obtrusive cameras and operators (iPhone for Facebook and video for You Tube) from the front of the congregation. The major question is whether Central continues to provide a digital ministry. After discussion, session approved the motion to make a digital ministry an ongoing part of our ministry. Those involved will gather information and put together a proposal with costs, equipment, and human resources needed to make a shift to a permanent installation. In the meantime, we will continue as we have been.
