Session Notes from October for the November Herald

Session met on October 11 to hear reports and conduct routine business. Highlights from the meeting appear below.

Featured Report: Mission Committee

The committee oversees our local benevolence spending, supporting Manna from Seven, Reach Services, 14th and Chestnut Community Center, CODA, Mental Health America, and the Unity and United Campus Ministry food pantries. In addition, we provide ongoing financial support to United Campus Ministries and contribute to PCUSA shared benevolence from which we have received grants that supported Operation Heart and the toiletries initiative for Manna from Seven. The committee will review our Christmas activities for their effectiveness and best fit with our congregation. They continue to consider activities through the lens of our Matthew 25 initiative to address racism and economic disparity, pondering our aspiration to be hands-on in addition to providing financial support, yet realizing that financial support is still important.

Treasurer Bruce McLaren presented the report and provided updates. There was a small deficit in September.

Christian Educator's Report: Sunday School is going well and the new elementary music program is off the ground with leadership from Brianna Stasel and funding from the McKee endowment interest.

Facilities:

Tom Bogigian reported on the failure of HVAC unit that controls the climate for the downstairs office area. The pastor will follow up with the person who did the repair to see if there is any recourse and we will again contact our insurance company. Bids will be gathered as appropriate and we will investigate available federal rebates, including those for installing a heat pump.

A much less costly estimate for replacing the choir spot lights has been obtained.

Bruce McLaren, reporting for the Virtual Ministry Design Team (Alan Harder, Joe Harder, Bruce McLaren, and Scott Racop), reviewed an equipment quote that was gathered after last month's session motion to make a digital ministry an ongoing part of our ministry. The plan is to run power and ethernet to a video station, run audio cabling from the sound cage, and install two cameras that pivot, tilt, pan, and zoom. The total cost will be around \$12,500 and the time table is around the end of the year. The system will need four to five well-trained operators in rotation.

Interpretation and Support: Groups were reminded to submit their budget requests.

Personnel: The committee completed its review of salary data comparisons and has recommended at 3.2% salary increase for next year.

New Business: Tom Bogigian shared the community bingo card from the BKIND project and suggested we obtain these for the congregation, complete them, and take a group photo that could be used to share our message. Ellie Templeton will follow up.
