"You've talked about it for so long...a few of us think it's time to do something."

If not a direct quote, these words capture the message of one attendee of our adult Sunday school class this fall. They refer to the theme I have hit pretty hard for months: the need for the Central Presbyterian to decide whether to evolve with the times.

Make no mistake, the world has changed. Most of us were born into a culture in which church participation was the norm. That has ended. Nowadays people choose to spend their Sunday mornings in all sorts of ways—most of them having nothing to do with worshiping God.

Rather than judging them, I want us to take a hard look at ourselves. We have continued "doing church" in substantially the same way since long before our oldest member was born. Some time ago, that stopped working for many people. Many remain active—and our church is better off than many—but participation in almost all Presbyterian churches has dropped. It has at Central.

What do we propose to do about this? Anything? Do we who remain active just want to keep on doing things the way we always have? You know the definition of insanity: to do things the same way while expecting different results.

As your pastor, I cannot countenance the idea of not addressing this situation. If we want to help people enter into a saving relationship with Jesus Christ, and to lead them into service to him and his creation, we need to consider adopting different practices.

In early January the next Strategic Planning Task Force will start its work. The thoughts in the previous paragraphs will be its focus. Please pray for this process. The Task Force's work will matter to our church, our members and people we may not yet have met, whom by the grace of God we may reach.

Session Notes from November for the December Herald

Session met on November 8 to hear reports and conduct routine business. Highlights from the meeting appear below.

Treasurer's Report:

Treasurer Bruce McLaren presented the report and provided updates. A CD has matured and a new one will be purchased.

Reports and Action Items from Committees and Commissions:

Facilities: Facilities will discuss HVAC issues further at their next meeting after more information becomes available. They have signed a service agreement that covers all units. By consensus, session agreed that if timing makes it necessary, we will review a recommendation from the commission and conduct an electronic vote on the use of cumulative maintenance funds.

Finance: The contract for installing video equipment has been signed. A motion from the commission to use up to \$4000 from the session discretionary fund and up to \$8000 from the Louise Danner fund to cover the cost of the equipment and installation for worship streaming was approved. The total cost is expected to be \$13,000 - \$14,000. Several contributions are expected and the work should be completed around the first of February.

Interpretation and Support: The committee has begun its work and will provide additional minutes for mission. Pledge Sunday is December 3 and right now the asking budget is \$17,000 over last year's.

Mission: We will have two Christmas mission trees this year. The angel tree will be focused on gifts for foster children. The giving tree will be moved indoors to collect items for the loyal veterans' battalion, who will distribute them as needed. The motion from the committee to allocate \$1000 in local benevolence to the Vigo County School Corporation backpack program and \$1500 to Reach Services for the day center was approved.
