# Sunday School Updates

Session approved a request to baptize Oliver Gilsinger, child of member Amanda (Green) Gilsinger and her husband, Jordan, on January 28, 2024.

Christian Educator's Report: New adult opportunities are being considered.

*Clerk's Report:* Member Carol Ennis died on December 6. Eight boxes of historic church records have been delivered to the library at Hanover College for archiving. The membership roll was reviewed and session voted to remove 22 names from the active roll. Of these, 16 have indicated they wish to be removed. The remaining six have either been contacted with no response, or we do not have contact information for them. The pastor will make a final attempt to contact these six with a written letter where possible.

#### **Reports and Action Items from Committees and Commissions:**

*Facilities*: Tom Bogigian noted that we will have service help on Martin Luther King, Jr. Day from ISU students and he will have them clean tables in advance of the United Campus Ministries chili supper in February.

**Interpretation and Support:** Brad Bough described the work of the committee, noting that they plan the stewardship campaign and prepare the operating budget. Sarah Kelsheimer, the financial secretary, has the institutional memory and is the only one to see submitted pledge cards. Brad then presented the preliminary budget, noting that although some cuts had been made from original requests, the 3.5% salary increases recommended by the personnel committee, based on presbytery guidelines, remain. A final version will be sent to session for an electronic vote prior to publication of the budget in the annual report.

**Mission**: The angel tree gifts have been delivered to the agency for distribution to foster children. Donations are coming in for the giving tree. Session approved the committee's motion for the distribution of the remaining \$2700 of local benevolence as follows: \$1000 to Manna from Seven, \$600 to CODA, \$500 to the Unity Food Pantry, and \$600 to 14<sup>th</sup> and Chestnut.

**Nominating:** Steve Mead reported that session nominees are complete with two new elders, two returning elders, and a youth elder. The committee continues to work on deacon vacancies.

Suggestions: When there is an outside event, the church member who is hosting should make sure that all equipment and materials have been returned to their proper placement. Be sure to turn on all five sanctuary light switches when opening on Sunday mornings.

The annual meeting of the congregation will take place on Sunday, January 28, 2024, at the close of worship. The joint meeting of the session and deacons will occur on February 14 at 5:30 (later changed to February 21 as the 14th is Ash Wednesday).

Thank you so much for the cards, other expressions of good will and the generous Christmas gift each of us received. We are so grateful for your love and support. Blessings to each of you for the new year.


