Christian Educator's Report:

The Lent series is working well in its new format during the Sunday School hour. Along with Andrew Conner, Ellie attended a training session for Haute Unlimited, a program that distributes sensory friendly backpacks for people of any age in public spaces

Reports and Action Items from Committees and Commissions:

Christian Nurture: The ladies' night out dinner was well-received with ten in attendance. Publicity for the Surrell Book Scholarship will be out soon. On April 26 the church is invited to attend the Rose-Hulman production of Beauty and the Beast.

Facilities: The elevator has passed its inspection and a heat sensor in the kitchen is being replaced. We are awaiting further evaluations for the water issue in the crawl space; the goal is to find a solution, not just a fix. Tom presented information about the insurance settlement for rooftop HVAC unit #3. Session authorized Facilities to proceed with the replacement of unit #3 if they decide to and if any increase in costs is no more than 7% above the October 2023 bid.

Session Notes: (continued)

Worship: The commission will be working on Good Friday and Maundy Thursday services. The new video system with Scott Racop and Joe Harder at the controls is working quite well and we may transition from Facebook live to YouTube live. The average viewing time is about 10 minutes.


Mission: The committee is thinking about keeping some supplies or gift cards on hand for needy visitors. In addition to providing resources, we need to be trained to be welcoming to everyone. This may include training on the use of the hearing devices and remembering to offer the elevator, large print bulletins, and Bibles in other languages as needed.

Personnel: Data for the pastor review will be collected by interview and survey through the end of the month. The committee will review the compiled results with the pastor.

They will meet at Centenary church for the month of April and will be preparing for youth Sunday service that will also take place at Centenary and is planned for Sunday, May 5.
