

In the book of Jeremiah, Jeremiah shares the statement: "I know the plans I have for you, says the Lord ... to give you a future with hope". These words reminded the Israelites that, despite their experience of the present, God's gesture, thoughts and plans for them — and for us — are peaceful, abundant and hopeful. We celebrate that God offers more than we can plan.

Report from the Strategic Planning Task Force

We began meeting in February. Most, if not all, of us have read a book by Tod Bolsinger, entitled <u>Canoeing the Mountains, Christian Leadership in Uncharted Territory</u>. It speaks of the changing landscape for the American church and the challenges this poses.

Using this and other books and articles we have come to the realization that Central ought to consider making changes in our life and ministry. We do not yet know what changes we might recommend. We will see where the Spirit leads us.

We have agreed that the existing Central Presbyterian Church mission statement is well-crafted and see no need to change it. We do, however, want to lift it up before the church. It reads: "We are a community of believers, called by God to grow in the knowledge and teaching of Christ, to share the love of Christ with all, and to respond with compassion to the needs of our changing world." And we have agreed to a brief vision statement: "Worship, Love, Serve". We hope every person associated with CPC will memorize this.

We plan to let these statements guide every facet of our work.
