Every Presbyterian congregation has the opportunity to pay an annual per capita assessment to the denomination. Central Presbyterian, maintaining its traditional support for the PC(USA) to which we belong, makes this payment in full. Sunday School updates

Thank you for helping to make the holidays brighter for these local children. We also collected items for our Giving Tree efforts. Several baskets full of coats, sweaters, hats, gloves, socks and hygiene items were donated to the Loyal Veterans Battalion which is located near REACH services "Pathways" shelter that serves our

local homeless population and amenities such as showers and a place to stay during extreme weather. The items donated by our church will be given directly to our local homeless in need. This was done in lieu of the tree being setup out in front of the church as a way to get items more directly to those who need them. We thank all for their donations and support of local mission and charities.

Session Notes from December for the January Herald

Session met on December 11 to hear reports and conduct business. Highlights from the meeting appear below.

Featured Report: Interpretation and Support Committee

Brad Bough provided an update on the work of the committee, whose members also include Murray Pate, Richard Templeton, and Bruce McLaren, with assistance from the pastor and financial secretary. They work in the fall to plan the stewardship campaign and begin preparation of a candidate budget with anticipated expenses based on information from commissions and committees. The campaign includes materials for bulletin inserts and interesting Minutes for Mission. This year there were 77 pledging units and people remain generous.

Christian Educator's Report: Ellie was pleased with the participation from all ages to make the children's Christmas program a success. Triennium will be in Louisville next summer.

Reports and Action Items from Committees and Commissions:

Christian Nurture: Unhanging of the greens will be on January 5 during the Sunday School hour.

Church Life: In the spring, the commission will solicit ideas for additional church activities.

Facilities: The freezer compressor repair (around \$1500) was paid from cumulative maintenance. In anticipation of the use of the sanctuary for piano recitals, we will review the building use policy and may offer recording services.

Finance: Our mortgage should be paid off in about six more years.

Worship: The Christmas Eve service will consist of traditional lessons and carols. Music will begin at 7:00 and the service at 7:30.

I&S: Brad Bough presented the candidate budget. It is balanced based on expected revenue. Most expense requests are unchanged with the exception of utilities and a 3% increase in staff compensation. Session approved the budget.

With more online and electronic giving, members tend to overlook the per capita contribution without seeing an envelope. The pastor will be more intentional with announcements and the office will supply blue envelopes. We might try a push at a different time of the year, perhaps near Central's birthday on May 17.

Mission: There is close to \$1500 left from this year's local benevolence, and in support of Rev. Andrew Black, a motion was approved to donate this to the Unity Presbyterian Food Pantry.

New Business:

The section of the church bylaws dealing with the number of elders and deacons was reviewed, as was the process for amending the bylaws. A motion to bring the following language change to the congregation at the January congregational meeting was approved.

Article III, Section 3

Current: Number of Ruling Elders; Qualification; Election; Removal. The Session shall be composed of no more than twenty-four (24) Ruling Elders.

Proposed: Number of Ruling Elders; Qualification; Election; Removal. The Session shall be composed of no more than fifteen Ruling Elders.

Article XI, Section I

Current: Membership. The Board of Deacons will consist of fifteen Deacons in three equal classes and pastor as ex officio.

Proposed: Membership. The Board of Deacons shall be composed of no more than fifteen Deacons and pastor as ex officio.
