#### Session Notes from June for the July Herald

Session met on June 11 to hear reports and conduct business. Highlights from the meeting appear below.

**Treasurer's Report:** Revenue for May was lower than budgeted and expenses were as budgeted. Following the advice of the Finance Commission's Investment Subcommittee, we redeemed the shares of Amana#I and Amana#2 and transferred the funds to the money market account at First Financial where they will be held until an investment strategy is determined.

**Christian Educator's Report**: VBS went well last week with almost 20 kids participating in the Downtown Dive and service projects.

#### Reports and Action Items from Committees and Commissions:

**Christian Nurture:** The commission will survey youth and their families to review and plan youth group activities. Nursery workers will work with the children during children's church.

**Facilities**: Session approved a motion to pay an invoice for \$2600 from cumulative maintenance for masonry work for the southwest corner. The handrails in the front of the sanctuary are being used, with gratitude.

**Finance:** A motion to authorize the commission to invest the funds in a prudent manner was tabled. The clerk volunteered to review past session minutes to see what policies had been established to guide investment decisions.

**Worship:** Alan Harder provided the schedule for upcoming pulpit supply. Thanks were expressed to elder Kevin Christ for filling the pulpit on June 8.

**Mission**: The two seats Central had filled on the United Campus Ministries board are vacant so we are looking for volunteers. We are also invited to send one name to the Lotus Center for their board. Donations are being accepted for Grace Spencer's Eagle Scout project with the center.

**Commissioner to Presbytery**: Each of the 14 amendments to the Book of Order was approved. There is a new committee for mission work and we should expect to receive a survey.

Old Business: Alan Finnan led a discussion of where we go from here in the search for pastoral leadership. He noted the option for either a gap or transitional pastor and indicated that such a decision will be a detail to be decided later. Presbytery Executive Rev. Susan McGhee has reached out to colleagues and is looking for a person with a very specific skill set. Additional sources include the Church Leadership Connection and the Midwest Call Finder. The search for a called pastor uses a congregational committee, but for interim staffing the committee is of the session. In answer to questions, Alan noted that the session will set compensation parameters and the interim will guide the timing until a pastor nominating committee (slated by the nominating committee and approved by the congregation) is established as interim work is being completed. Each elder present was asked to list the names of three active elders to serve on the interim search. Beth Christ, Andrew Conner, Corrine Foree, Alan Harder, and Steve Mead were nominated, approved, and have agreed to serve. Susan McGhee will provide training and guidance.

**New Business**: Session discussed the issues of home communion, pastoral care, and office administration during this time without an installed pastor.

An elder who has been trained in serving the sacraments can offer home communion along with a deacon. Alan Harder fits this and will offer this option with the deacons.

Several ideas for pastoral care are under consideration and could be finalized soon.

We need additional help to cover the office. Sarah and Ellie have done a superb job keeping things moving, but more help is needed. At this point of the meeting, Ellie Templeton announced that she will be leaving the Christian Educator position as of June 30 to take a new position that will be a professional advancement. She reiterated that she and her family will remain at Central, that she is willing to stay on as the communications director, and that this decision was solely for professional reasons. Session voted to accept this verbal resignation with regret, congratulations, and thanks. Coverage of the office, particularly when Sarah is on vacation, will be referred to the personnel committee. Session authorized Rachael Spencer and Phillip Smith to sign vouchers (in addition to corporation president Brad Bough) as needed.

The congregation can be assured that office operations will be covered, that resources for pastoral care are available, that a schedule for Sunday worship is set, and that the search committee for interim leadership has been established.
