A note from Joy:


Peace and Greetings to you All,

Session met on September 10 to hear reports and conduct business. Highlights from the meeting appear below.

Featured Report: Finance Commission

Phillip Smith distributed a written summary of the work of the commission. The members, consisting of former treasurers and those with professional financial experience, review the work of the treasurer and the financial secretary, and monitor the church's financial position and investments. The question of an alternate and responsible investment vehicle was again raised and Phillip will take information about the suggestion to the commission for evaluation.

Treasurer's Report: Beth Christ noted that it was a good month, with expected revenue and lower than budgeted expenses.

Reports and Action Items from Committees and Commissions:

Christian Nurture: the commission met online. The Sunday School year started with a kick-off breakfast and classes will begin next week. An adult class is in the works.

Church Life: Susan Moulton called attention to the September 18 lunch at MCL.

Facilities: ISU students will help on October 25 for a Service Saturday. Masonry work is coming up. Storage rooms need to be cleared out—the commission will provide labor but will need help with decisions. The roof leak has been fixed and the electrical panel and thermostats labeled.

Worship: There will be a welcome back reception for the choir this Sunday.

Mission: A motion from the committee to allocate donations from local benevolence was approved: 14th and Chestnut, \$2500; CODA, \$1000, and Reach Services, \$1000. All organizations are consistent with our MA 25 focus

Personnel: New Christian Educator Joy Sutter will begin work next Sunday. The commission is looking for an additional member. A review of the Policies and Procedures manual has begun and materials have been shared with Rev. Susan McGhee for her expertise.

Interim/Transitional Pastor Search Committee: The committee meets tonight and will provide an update.

Old Business: The scout troop has found a sponsoring organization so will not need us.

New Business: Tom Bogigian called attention to the Optimist International chili cook-off. We will encourage attendance but will not participate as a church.
