Per Capita payments

Every Presbyterian congregation has the opportunity to pay an annual per capita assessment to the denomination. Central Presbyterian, maintaining its traditional support for the PC(USA) to which we belong, makes this payment in full. We ask every member prayerfully to consider making an additional contribution--over and above your offering pledges--to cover this expense for our church. In 2026 the amount is \$61.00 per active member. You will find a special envelope on the back tables in the sanctuary for this assessment.

Also, there are a few sets of offering envelopes available for anyone wishing to receive envelopes.

Session Notes from December for the January Herald

Session met on December 10 to hear reports and conduct business. Highlights from the meeting appear below.

Featured Report: Interpretation and Support Committee

Brad Bough thanked Murray Pate, Bruce McLaren, and financial secretary Sarah Kelsheimer for their work on this year's stewardship campaign. The theme Measuring What Matters was used in conjunction with well-received personal reflections during Minutes for Mission. Brad explained the process of the campaign and presented the proposed budget. In response to a question, he noted that the operating fund is used for day-to-day expenses and that non-recurring expenses can be met from other designated funds. A motion to accept the budget as proposed and present it to the congregation at the annual meeting in January was approved by session.

Treasurer's Report: Beth Christ noted that we have both a monthly and year-to-date surplus, in part due to not having an installed pastor. The payments to former pastor Mike Riggins are now complete.

Christian Educator's Report: Joy Sutter reported that the Advent painting party was well attended. She thanked the church life commission for snacks and the Kershaw family for the extra food from the soccer banquet. Hanging of the Greens went well and we are trying to find a good home for the surplus sanctuary tree. The children's art show raised \$96 for the Humane Society. Consideration is being given to finding a second adult presence for the youth group as well as an additional nursery worker. The Pyoca youth retreat went well and may lead to joint activities or a mission trip with other youth who were there.

Reports and Action Items from Committees and Commissions:

Church Life: Susan Moulton reviewed completed activities and noted the carry-in lunch this coming Sunday and a puzzle party/soup supper on January 11.

Facilities: Tom Bogigian reported that the washer is broken and replacement is more economical than repair. He anticipated needing new gutters over the north- and southwest corners next year. The pastor's office has been painted and carpets will be cleaned on December 19.

Worship: Pastoral coverage is set through January 5. Jonathan Sutter will serve for the Christmas Eve Lessons and Carols service and we will have our normal wassail and cookies. Readers are needed.

Mission: Susan Hoffman reported that we did receive the \$2500 POV grant and it has been given to Manna from Seven, who used it for Thanksgiving food distribution. The committee prepared eight pans of lasagna for the Lotus Center. The congregation supported 21 children through this year's angel tree.
